

## English

This term our English lessons will be linked to our thematic topic and the book Stig of the Dump. Key skills will continue to be taught, including how to use different types of sentences (statement, question, command and exclamation) for effect as well as improving and widening their vocabulary. They will also continue to develop their use of the apostrophe and inverted commas in dialogue.

We will also be looking at techniques to extend sentences and how to add detail. They will continue to learn about subordinating conjunctions (because, when, if, that), coordinating conjunctions (and, but, so, or) and expanded noun phrases.

## Maths

- During this term we will continue to focus on basic skills including, multiplication and division, subtraction and fractions.
- During our shape and measure topic we will investigate types of angles, area and perimeter as well as learning to read and use time accurately.
- We will be learning to recall multiplication and division facts for 3- 4- and 8-times tables as well as completing missing number calculations.
