Before we broke up for the school holidays, we asked our children to complete a Pupil Questionnaire. It was wonderful to read through all the responses and the positive comments. Here are just a few: -

Teachers will usually assess children's work over a number of weeks to decide whether they're ready for a pen licence.

To get a pen licence, children need to:

- Using a correct pencil grip
- Writing on the line
- Joining letters correctly
- Starting each letter in the correct place
- Keeping letters the same size
- Forming letters with the correct shape
- Leaving appropriate gaps between words
- Ensuring that ascending and descending strokes are the right length
- Writing clearly enough for other people to read their work

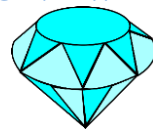
